

All-on-X™ Training Program

Training for General Dentists · Zero to Hero in 5 Days

A five-day, Monday-through-Friday hands-on intensive covering All-on-X treatment, multiple implant placement, surgical treatment planning, sinus lift procedures, restorative workflows, and live patient surgery.*

Learning Objectives

- Diagnose and treatment plan full-arch All-on-X cases from records to delivery.
- Place multiple implants with predictable primary stability and correct angulation.*
- Perform indirect and direct sinus lift procedures and manage complications.*
- Execute a live patient All-on-X surgery with immediate provisionalization.*
- Deliver and maintain full-arch restorations using digital and analog workflows.*
- Integrate All-on-X into a general practice: case presentation, fees, and follow-up.

Daily Curriculum

Day 1 — Monday — Diagnosis, Records & All-on-X Treatment Planning

- Comprehensive full-arch diagnosis: failing dentition, terminal dentition, edentulous mandible/maxilla
- CBCT interpretation: bone volume, sinus anatomy, nerve mapping, and A-P spread
- Photographic and digital records protocol; facially driven prosthetic planning
- Vertical dimension, smile design, and prosthetic space requirements for All-on-X
- Case selection, medical risk stratification, and contraindications
- Building the surgical plan: implant count, angulation, and multiple implant placement strategy*

Day 2 — Tuesday — Surgical Foundations & Multiple Implant Placement

- Sterile field, infection control, and OR discipline for the general practice
- Flap design, extraction with socket preservation, and alveoloplasty
- Osteotomy sequencing, torque management, and primary stability targets
- Multiple implant placement on models and typodonts prior to live surgery*
- Angled implant placement to avoid anatomic structures
- Hands-on surgical assisting rotations

Day 3 — Wednesday — Sinus Lift Procedures & Bone Management

- Sinus anatomy, membrane biology, and radiographic assessment
- Indirect (crestal) sinus lift technique and instrumentation*
- Direct (lateral window) sinus lift: access, membrane elevation, grafting*
- Membrane perforation management and complication avoidance
- Graft material selection, membranes, and fixation
- Ridge augmentation adjuncts within a comprehensive All-on-X plan

Day 4 — Thursday — Live Patient All-on-X Surgery

- Pre-op huddle, patient evaluation, and final plan confirmation at the time of surgery*
- Live patient full-arch surgery: extractions, alveoloplasty, implant placement*
- Multi-arch and multiple All-on-X case rotations across the cohort*
- Multi-unit abutment selection and seating; torque protocol
- Clinical surgical time — every doctor leads and first-assists
- Intra-operative decision making and bail-out strategies

Day 5 — Friday — Restorative Workflows, Delivery & Practice Integration

- Immediate provisional conversion and occlusal scheme for full-arch
- Digital and analog impression/scan workflows for the definitive prosthesis*
- Lab communication, material selection, and prosthesis design
- Post-op protocols, medications, hygiene, and long-term maintenance
- Complication management: screw loosening, fracture, peri-implantitis
- Case presentation, fee structuring, and integrating All-on-X into a general practice
- Certificate of Completion

Assessment & Certification

- Pre-course remote didactic modules must be completed before arrival.
- Daily hands-on competency checkpoints observed by faculty.
- Live surgical participation as operator and first assistant.*
- Certificate of Completion issued Friday upon meeting all checkpoints.

Case-Type Flex

Daily surgical assignments are matched to the live patient book that week. Every doctor leads and first-assists on All-on-X arches across the cohort. Same tuition, same certificate.

*** Clinical procedures.** Clinical procedures, including All-on-X, multiple implant placement, sinus lift procedures, restorations, and related surgical techniques, are performed only when clinically indicated. Final treatment plans are determined during patient evaluation and confirmed at the time of surgery.

Licensing. Participants must hold an active dental license in the state where they perform clinical procedures. Any required Nevada licensure applies only to clinical activities conducted in Nevada.
